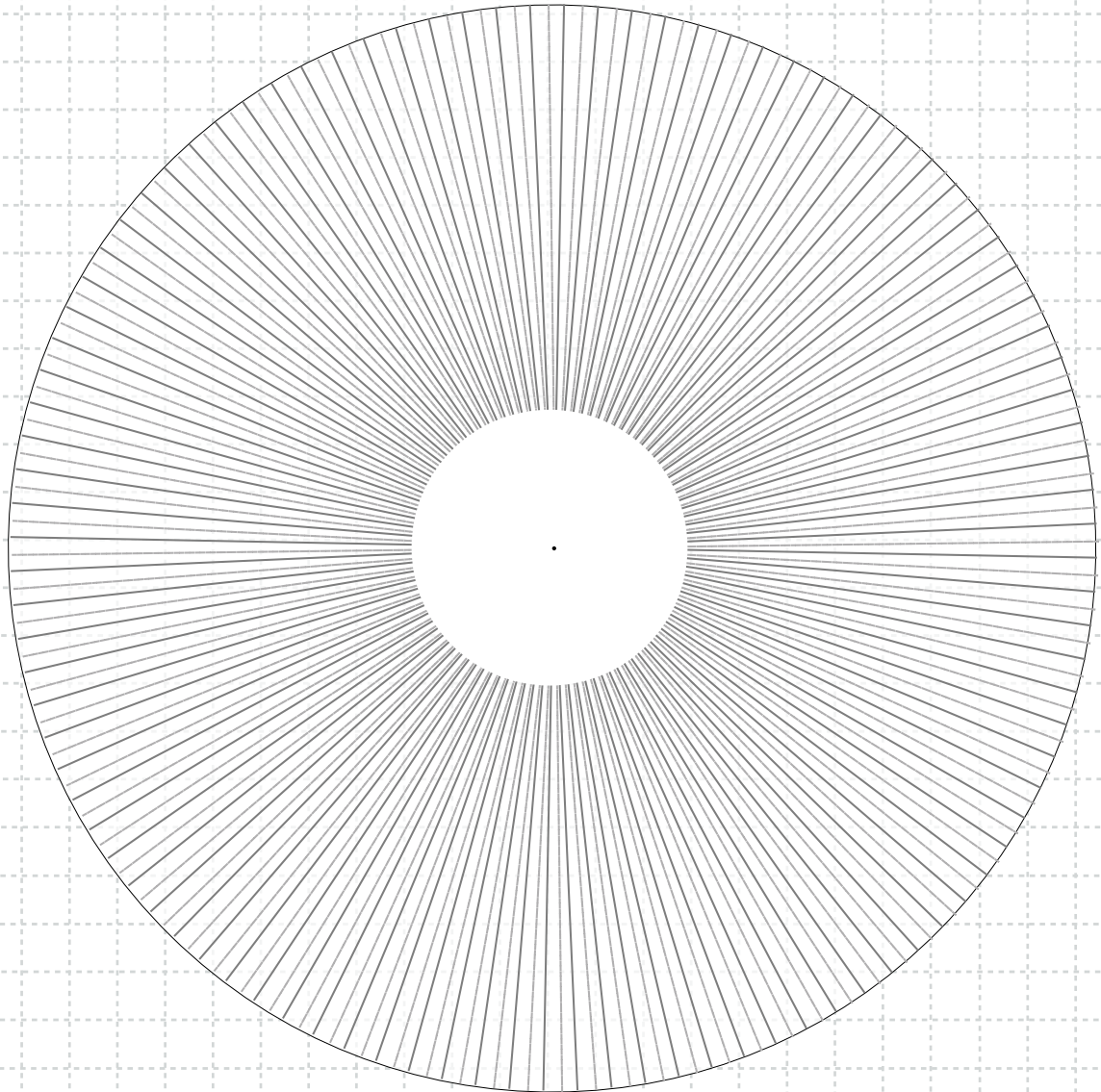


# Graphing – 1.13
